Report - Student Satisfaction Survey (2019-20)

The College conducted a Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) regarding teaching-learning and evaluation under Criterion II in 2019-20. The survey was administered online using Google form during 15th March to 15th May 2020. The questionnaire consisted of total 20 questions regarding teaching-learning and evaluation, every question has five responses and a student has to choose any one response for each question with her/his sincere effort and thought. In this survey total 73 students participated from, BA (RS) Part- I, BA (RS) Part -II and BA (RS) Part- III.

Question-wise analysis of the students' responses is as follows:

- 1. The syllabus covered in the class:
 - According to 64.38% students 85 to 100% syllabus was covered in the class; 24.66% students responded that 70 to 84% syllabus was covered; 9.59% responded that 52 to 69% syllabus was covered, 1.37% responded that 30 to 54% syllabus was covered
- 2. The teachers preparation for the classes:
 - According to 39.73% students the teachers prepared *thoroughly* for the class, 42.47% students responded that teachers prepared *satisfactorily*, 12.33% students responded that the teachers prepared *Poorly* for the class, 1.37% students responded that the teachers prepared *indifferently* for the class, where as 4.11% students responded that the teachers *Won't teach at all* in the class.
- 3. The teachers ability to communicate:
 - According to 76.71% students the teachers communication was *always effective*, for 19.18% students it was *sometimes effective*, 2.74% students responded that the teachers' communication was *just satisfactorily*, and for 1.37% students it was *generally effective*
- 4. The teacher's approach to teaching: according to 42.47% students the teachers approach to teaching can be best described as excellent whereas for 43.84% students it was very good, for 12.33% students it was good, and for 1.37% students it was fair.
- 5. Fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers: According to 64.38% students the fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers was always fair, for 28.77% students it was usually fair, 5.48% students responded that it was sometimes unfair, whereas 1.37% students responded that it was unfair.
- 6. Discussing Students' Performance in Assessment with the students: according to 64.38% students the performance in assignments was discussed every time, according to 21.92% students it was discussed usually, 8.22% students responded that responded that it was discussed occasionally/sometimes, according to 2.74% students it was discussed never.

- 7. The institute's initiatives in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students: according to 64.38% students the institute regularly takes interest in promoting such opportunities for students, according to 10.96% students responded as often, 20.55% students responded that it was sometimes, whereas 4.11% students responded as never
- 8. The teaching and mentoring process facilitates in cognitive, social and emotional growth: according to 35.62% students teaching and monitoring process in the college significantly facilitates in their cognitive, social and emotional growth, according to 56.16% students it facilitates very well, 4.11% students responded that it was moderately, 2.74% students responded that it was marginally, whereas 1.37% students responded as not at all
- 9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow: 32.88% students responded to this as *strongly agree*, 56.16% students responded to this as *agree*, whereas 10.96% students responded to this as *neutral*.
- 10. Teachers inform students about students' expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes: according to 71.23% students teachers inform them every time about their expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes; according to 17.81% students the teachers inform them usually about the same; according to 5.48% students the teachers inform them occasionally/sometimes; according to 4.11% students the teachers inform them rarely; only one student (1.37%) responded that the teachers never informed him.
- 11. Necessary follow-up by mentor with an assigned task: according to 61.64% students their mentor does the necessary follow-up with an assigned task to them every time, according to 27.40% students their mentor does follow up usually, 8.22% students responded that the teachers informed them occasionally/sometimes, whereas only two students (2.74%) responded as I don't have a mentor.
- 12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications: according to 56.16% students the teachers every time illustrate the concepts through examples and applications, according to 35.62% students the response was usually, according to 4.11% students the response was occasionally/sometimes, according to 1.37% students the response was rarely, whereas according to 2.74% students responded as never.
- 13. The teacher identifies student strengths and encourage them providing right level of challenges: according to 57.53% students the teachers fully identified their strengths and encourage them providing right level of challenges, according to 28.77% students and teachers act reasonably, according to 5.48% students and teachers act partially, according to 6.85% students and teachers act slightly, only one student (1.37%) responded to this as 'unable to'.
- 14. Teachers identify students weaknesses and help to overcome them: according to 61.64% students the teachers were able to identify the weaknesses and help them to overcome it every time, according to 23.29% students the response was usually, according to 10.96% students the response was occasionally/sometimes, according to 2.74% students the response was rarely, whereas 1.37% students responded as never.
- 15. Institution's efforts to engage students in monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process: 47.95% students were strongly agree to this statement, 38.36% students were agree, 12.33% students were neutral, and 1.37% students were disagree with this statement.

- 16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.
 - According to 56.16% students teachers use student centric methods to a great extent, according to 32.88% students the teachers use student centric methods in moderate way, for 4.11% students the teachers somewhat use student centric methods, for 5.48% students the teachers use very little use student centric methods, whereas according to one student (1.37%) teachers not at all use student centric methods.
- 17. The teachers encourage the students to participate in extracurricular activities: : 41.10% students were *strongly agree* to this statement, 46.58% students were *agree*, 10.96% students were *neutral*, and 1.37%students were *disagree* with this statement.
- 18. Efforts made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make the students ready for the world of work.

 According to 58.90% students the institute/teachers take efforts to a great extent, according to 30.14% students the institute/teachers take moderate efforts, 2.74% students responded as somewhat, whereas 8.22% students responded as very little.
- 19. Percentage of teachers using ICT: according to 39.73% students *above 90%* teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia etc. while teaching; according to 27.40% students 70-89% teachers use ICT tools; according to 20.55% students 50-69% teachers use ICT tools, according to 8.22% students the percentage of teachers using ICT tools was 30-49% and according to 4.11% students the percentage of teachers using ICT tools was below 29%
- 20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in the institution is very good: 58.90% students are *strongly agree* to this statement, 32.88% students are *agree*. 2.74% students responded as *neutral* whereas one student (1.37%) responded as *strongly disagree* to the statement.

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
