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Report - Student Satisfaction Survey (2020-21)

The College conducted a Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) regarding teaching-learning and evaluation under Criterion II in 2020-21. The survey was administered online using Google form during 30th July to 15th August 2021. The questionnaire consisted of total 20 questions regarding teaching-learning and evaluation, every question has five responses, and a student has to choose any one response for each question with her/his sincere effort and thought.

In this survey total 152 students participated from, BA (RS) Part- I, BA (RS) Part -II and BA (RS) Part- III. Gender wise 83 Female and 69 Male students participated in the survey.

Question-wise analysis of the students' responses is as follows:

1. The syllabus covered in the class:

According to 68.4% students 85 to 100% syllabus was covered in the class; 23% students responded that 70 to 84% syllabus was covered in the classroom.

2. The teachers preparation for the classes:

According to 46.1% students the teachers prepared *thoroughly* for the class, 42.1% students responded that teachers prepared *satisfactorily*, whereas 7.3% students responded that the teachers prepared either *poorly* or *indifferently* for the class, and 4.6% students responded that the teachers *Won't teach at all* in the class.

3. The teachers' ability to communicate:

According to 74.3% students the teachers' communication was *always effective*, for 13.2% students it was *sometimes effective*. For 6.2% students teachers' communication was either *just satisfactorily* or *generally ineffective* whereas for 5.9% students teachers' communication was *very poor*

4. The teacher's approach to teaching: according to 50% students the teacher's approach to teaching can be best described as *excellent*, for 30.9% students it was *very good*, for 15.1% students it was *good*.

5. Fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers: According to 69.1% students the fairness of internal evaluation process by the teachers was *always fair*, for 14.5% students it was *usually fair*, whereas 11.8% students responded that it was *sometimes unfair* and for some students (4.6%) it ranged from *usually unfair* to *unfair*.

6. Discussing Students' Performance in Assessment with the students: according to 75.7% students the performance in assignments was discussed *every time*, according to 12.5% students it was discussed *usually*, 7.9% students responded that responded that it was discussed *occasionally/sometimes*.


7. The institute's initiatives in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students: according to 72.4% students the institute *regularly* takes interest in promoting such opportunities for students, according to 8.6% students

responded as *often*, 14.5% students responded that it was *sometimes*, whereas 4.6% students responded as *rarely* and *never*

8. **The teaching and mentoring process facilitates in cognitive, social and emotional growth** : according to 41.4% students, the teaching and monitoring process in the college *significantly* facilitates in their cognitive, social and emotional growth, according to 42.8% students it facilitates *very well*, 11.2% students responded that it was *moderately*.
9. **The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow:** 49.3% students responded to this as *strongly agree*, 35.5% students responded to this as *agree*, whereas 11.2% students responded as *neutral*.
10. **Teachers inform students about students' expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes:** according to 70.4% students and teachers inform them *every time* about their expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes; according to 14.5% students the teachers inform them *usually* about the same; according to 9.9% students the teachers inform them *occasionally/sometimes*; according to 3.3% students the teachers *rarely* inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and program outcomes.
11. **Necessary follow-up by mentor with an assigned task:** according to 67.8% students their mentor does the necessary follow-up with an assigned task to them *every time*, according to 15.1% students their mentor does follow up *usually*, 8.6% students responded that the teachers informed them *occasionally/sometimes*, whereas 5.9% students responded as *rarely*.
12. **The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications:** according to 70.4% students the teachers *every time* illustrate the concepts through examples and applications, according to 13.2% students the response was *usually*, according to 8.6% students the response was *occasionally/sometimes*.
13. **The teacher identifies student strengths and encourage them providing right level of challenges:** according to 59.2% students the teachers *fully* identified their strengths and encourage them providing right level of challenges, according to 23% students and teachers act *reasonably*, according to 9.2% students and teachers act *partially*, according to 6.6% students and teachers act *slightly*.
14. **Teachers identify students' weaknesses and help to overcome them:** according to most of the students (73.7%) the teachers were able to identify the weaknesses and help them to overcome it *every time*, 14.5% students responded as *usually*, whereas according to 11.2% students it was either *occasionally* or *rarely*
15. **Institution's efforts to engage students in monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching-learning process:** 52% students responded as *strongly agree* to this statement, 32.9% students *agree*, 11.2% students were *neutral*.
16. **The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.**
According to 60.5% students teachers use student centric methods to *a great extent*, according to 25.7% students the teachers use student centric methods in a *moderate* way, for 9.9% students the teachers *somewhat use* student centric methods, for 2.6% students the teachers use *very little* use student centric methods.

17. **The teachers encourage the students to participate in extracurricular activities:** :
53.9% students strongly agree to this statement, 31.6% students agree and 9.2% students are *neutral*.
18. **Efforts made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make the students ready for the world of work.**
According to 64.5% students the institute/teachers take efforts to *a great extent*, according to 20.4% students the institute/teachers take *moderate* efforts, whereas according to 5.9% students the response was *somewhat*, and 6.6% students responded as *very little*.
19. **Percentage of teachers using ICT:** according to 50% students *above 90%* teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia etc. while teaching; according to 29.6% students *70-89%* teachers use ICT tools; according to 12.5% students *50-69%* teachers use ICT tools, according to 5.3% students the percentage of teachers using ICT tools was *30-49%* and according to 2.6% students the percentage of teachers using ICT tools was *below 29%*
20. **The overall quality of teaching-learning process in the institution is very good:** the response of 61.2% students to this statement was *strongly agree*, 23% students responded as *agree*, whereas 11.8% students responded as *neutral*.
