Report - Student Satisfaction Survey (2022-23)

The College conducted a Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) regarding teaching-learning and evaluation under Criterion II in 2022-23. The survey was administered online using Google form during 5 May 2023 to 15 July 2023. The questionnaire consisted of total 21 questions regarding teaching-learning and evaluation. First 20 questions have five responses each and a student has to choose any one response for each question with her/his sincere effort and thought. Question number 21 is about students' observation or suggestions. The survey was conducted through Google Form.

In this survey total 104 students participated from, BA (RS) Part- I, BA (RS) Part -II and BA (RS) Part- III. Gender wise 56 Female and 48 Male students participated in the survey.

Student Satisfaction Survey Analysis Report

The results of first 20 questions are analyzed by considering the sum of the highest two responses for each question.

Analysis

1. Syllabus Coverage: A significant majority (84.6% = 72.1% (85 to 100%) + 12.5% (70 to 84%)) of students reported that 70-100% of the syllabus was covered in class.

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- 2. Teacher Preparation: Most students (88.4% = 59.6% (Thoroughly) + 28.8% (Satisfactorily)) felt that teachers prepared for classes either satisfactorily or thoroughly.
- **3.** Communication: The majority of students (83.7% = 70.2% (Always effective) + 13.5% (Sometimes effective)) found the teachers' communication to be effective always or sometimes.
- 4. Teaching Approach: Most students (85.6% = 51.0% (Excellent) + 34.6% (Very good)) described the teachers' approach to teaching as excellent or very good.
- 5. Evaluation Fairness: A large majority (92.3% = 76.0% (Always fair) + 16.3% (Usually fair)) of students felt that the internal evaluation process by the teachers was always or usually fair.
- 6. Assignment Discussion: Most students (94.2% = 79.8% (Every time) + 14.4% (Usually)) reported that their performance in assignments was discussed with them every time or usually.
- 7. Internship Promotion: The majority of students (85.6% = 73.1% (Regularly) + 12.5% (Often)) felt that the institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students regularly or often.
- 8. Teaching and Mentoring: Most students (92.3% = 51.9% (Significantly) + 40.4% (Very well)) felt that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution significantly or very well facilitates them in cognitive, social and emotional growth.
- **9. Learning Opportunities**: A large majority (91.4% = 57.7% (Strongly agree) + 33.7% (Agree)) of students strongly agreed or agreed that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.
- **10. Competency Information**: Most students (89.4% = 73.1% (Every time) + 16.3% (Usually)) reported that teachers inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes every time or usually.
- **11. Mentor Follow-up**: The majority of students (91.4% = 73.1% (Every time) + 18.3% (Usually)) felt that their mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to them every time or usually.
- 12. Concept Illustration: Most students (94.3% = 80.8% (Every time) + 13.5% (Usually)) reported that the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications every time or usually.
- 13. Strength Identification: A large majority (93.3% = 77.9% (Fully) + 15.4% (Reasonably)) of students felt that the teachers fully or reasonably identify their strengths and encourage them with providing right level of challenges.
- 14. Weakness Identification: Most students (89.4% = 76.9% (Every time) + 12.5% (Usually)) reported that teachers are able to identify their weaknesses and help them to overcome them every time or usually.
- **15. Quality Improvement**: A majority of students (87.5% = 56.7% (Strongly agree) + 30.8% (Agree)) strongly agreed or agreed that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.

- 16. Student Centric Methods: Most students (87.5% = 64.4% (To a great extent) + 23.1% (Moderate)) felt that the institute/teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences to a great extent or moderately.
- 17. Extracurricular Activities: Most students (90.4% = 58.7% (Strongly agree) + 31.7% (Agree)) strongly agreed or agreed that teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities.
- 18. Skill Development: A majority of students (90.4% = 69.2% (To a great extent) + 21.2% (Moderate)) felt that efforts are made by the institute/teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work to a great extent or moderately.
- **19. Use of ICT tools:** Most students (71.1% = 47.1% (Above 90%) + 24.0% (70 89%)) reported that above 70% of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.
- **20. Overall Quality**: A large majority (93.2% = 53.8% (Strongly agree) + 39.4% (Agree)) of students strongly agreed or agreed that the overall quality of teaching-learning process in their institute is very good.
- 21. Give three observation / suggestions to improve the overall teaching learning experience in your institution.

Total 48 students responded to this question. Most of the students mentioned that their teaching learning experience in the institution was "good", "very good", "encouraging", "supportive environment", "regular lectures", "good teachers".

A few students observed that there is 'environmental awareness' in college and caring of birds 'very influential'. Teachers 'use better graphics and visual media to engage students', 'try to reach every student and ask for their doubts', 'make teaching a two way interaction'

A few students suggested the need for 'bus stand, and 'new courses'

Conclusion

In conclusion, the survey results indicate a high level of student satisfaction with the teaching-learning process in the institute.
