## Report - Student Satisfaction Survey (2023-24)

The College conducted a Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) regarding teaching-learning and evaluation under Criterion II in 2023-24. The survey was administered online using Google form during 24 July to 28 September 2024. The questionnaire consisted of total 21 questions regarding teaching-learning and evaluation. First 20 questions have five responses each and a student has to choose any one response for each question with her/his sincere effort and thought. Question number 21 is about students' observation or suggestions. The survey was conducted through Google Form.

In this survey total 66 students participated from, BA (RS) Part- I, BA (RS) Part -II and BA (RS) Part- III. Gender wise 46 Female and 20 Male students participated in the survey.

### Student Satisfaction Survey Analysis Report

The results of first 20 questions are analyzed by considering the sum of the highest two responses for each question.

#### Question-Wise Analysis:

##### 1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

- **Highest Responses:**
  - 85-100%: 62.1%
  - 70-84%: 13.6%
- **Analysis:** Majority of students (75.7%) reported that more than 70% of the syllabus was covered, reflecting effective curriculum delivery.

##### 2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

- **Highest Responses:**
  - *Thoroughly*: 53.0%
  - *Satisfactorily*: 36.4%
- **Analysis:** A significant majority (89.4%) felt that teachers were either thoroughly or satisfactorily prepared, indicating consistent effort in class preparation.

##### 3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

- **Highest Responses:**
  - *Always effective*: 56.1%
  - *Sometimes effective*: 24.2%
- **Analysis:** Communication was rated highly by 80.3% of respondents, demonstrating strong teacher-student interaction.



4. **The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as:**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Excellent:* 40.9%
    - *Very good:* 37.9%
  - **Analysis:** Most students (78.8%) rated the teaching approach as excellent or very good, reflecting satisfaction with teaching methods.
5. **Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Always fair:* 63.6%
    - *Usually fair:* 25.8%
  - **Analysis:** Fair evaluation practices were affirmed by 89.4% of students, indicating transparency and equity in assessments.
6. **Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Every time:* 59.1%
    - *Usually:* 21.2%
  - **Analysis:** The majority (80.3%) felt their performance was consistently reviewed, suggesting effective feedback mechanisms.
7. **The institute takes active interest in promoting internships, student exchanges, and field visits.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Regularly:* 45.5%
    - *Sometimes:* 34.8%
  - **Analysis:** While 45.5% felt regular opportunities were provided, a notable 34.8% indicated occasional initiatives, highlighting room for improvement.
8. **The teaching and mentoring process facilitates cognitive, social, and emotional growth.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Very well:* 43.9%
    - *Significantly:* 39.4%
  - **Analysis:** Combined, 83.3% affirmed the positive impact of teaching and mentoring on their growth, showcasing holistic development efforts.
9. **The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Strongly agree:* 42.4%
    - *Agree:* 40.9%
  - **Analysis:** A vast majority (83.3%) acknowledged diverse learning opportunities, reflecting a strong institutional commitment.
10. **Teachers inform you about competencies, course outcomes, and program outcomes.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Every time:* 51.5%
    - *Usually:* 31.8%
  - **Analysis:** About 83.3% of respondents found teachers diligent in outlining course expectations, ensuring clarity in learning objectives.
11. **Your mentor follows up on assigned tasks.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Every time:* 60.6%
    - *Usually:* 21.2%
  - **Analysis:** The majority (81.8%) reported consistent follow-up by mentors, signifying robust guidance systems.



- 12. Teachers illustrate concepts through examples and applications.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Every time:* 48.5%
    - *Usually:* 33.3%
  - **Analysis:** Effective conceptual teaching was acknowledged by 81.8%, highlighting an application-driven learning approach.
- 13. Teachers identify your strengths and provide appropriate challenges.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Fully:* 53.0%
    - *Reasonably:* 24.2%
  - **Analysis:** About 77.2% felt teachers were adept at identifying and addressing their strengths, supporting personalized growth.
- 14. Teachers identify your weaknesses and help you overcome them.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Every time:* 62.1%
    - *Usually:* 16.7%
  - **Analysis:** A combined 78.8% confirmed consistent support in addressing weaknesses, showcasing a student-centric teaching approach.
- 15. The institution engages students in quality improvement of the teaching-learning process.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Strongly agree:* 45.5%
    - *Agree:* 36.4%
  - **Analysis:** Active engagement in quality improvement was recognized by 81.9%, indicating participatory decision-making.
- 16. Teachers use student-centric methods for enhancing learning experiences.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *To a great extent:* 48.5%
    - *Moderate:* 31.8%
  - **Analysis:** About 80.3% felt the use of innovative methods positively impacted their learning experience.
- 17. Teachers encourage extracurricular participation.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Strongly agree:* 56.1%
    - *Agree:* 24.2%
  - **Analysis:** Strong encouragement of extracurriculars was noted by 80.3%, promoting well-rounded development.
- 18. Efforts are made to inculcate employability skills.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *To a great extent:* 48.5%
    - *Moderate:* 33.3%
  - **Analysis:** A majority (81.8%) affirmed the institution's focus on employability, emphasizing readiness for professional challenges.
- 19. Teachers use ICT tools for teaching.**
- **Highest Responses:**
    - *Above 90%:* 42.4%
    - *70–89%:* 31.8%
  - **Analysis:** High ICT usage was reported by 74.2%, reflecting technological integration in teaching.



**20. The overall quality of the teaching-learning process is very good.**

- **Highest Responses:**
  - *Strongly agree:* 45.5%
  - *Agree:* 39.4%
- **Analysis:** An overwhelming 84.9% rated the overall quality as very good, indicating broad satisfaction.

**21 Give three observation / suggestions to improve the overall teaching – learning experience in your institution.**


Total 17 students responded to this question. Most of the students mentioned that their teaching learning experience in the institution was “good”, “very good”, “good teachers” . Some students appreciated teaching quality (e.g., "all teachers are good in their teaching skills"), while few called for **occasional revisions** ("occasional revision is required," "We will take the help of the teacher wherever necessary") A few students suggested higher use of ICT. One suggestion is about project based, research-oriented teaching.

**Conclusion**


In conclusion, the survey results highlight significant satisfaction among students regarding teaching effectiveness, fairness in evaluation, and mentoring. Strengths include:


